ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

Medical Laboratory Science (MLS)

The MLS program begins once each year in the summer term (late May). Required application materials can be <u>submitted as they are completed, but all materials must be received before admission consideration.</u> Completed applicant files are reviewed on a rolling basis, and the process requires 3 to 4 weeks.

Enrollment is granted for a specific term. All admission criteria must be maintained, including satisfactory completion of required general education courses prior to beginning the program.

Early Applicants

The following criterion must be met:

- Completed fewer than 25 college credits
- Minimum high school cumulative grade point average of 3.8 on a 4.0 scale
- Earned a grade of C- or higher in all prerequisite general education courses

Transfer Applicants

The following criterion must be met:

- Before admission review, transfer applicants must have earned 60 college credits, including 12 credits of the required natural science and/or mathematics prerequisites
- A minimum grade point average of 2.7 (on a 4.0 scale) in the following courses:

Biology*

Oral Communication

Microbiology*

Sociology

o Chemistry*

Psychology

o Organic Chemistry*

Anatomy and Physiology*

College Math*

- * Courses used in GPA for students with a previous bachelor's degree at the time of application
- Earned a grade of C- or higher in all prerequisite general education courses

Applicants whose first language is not English must prove <u>English proficiency</u> prior to admission consideration.

Students without a clear criminal background check may not be allowed to attend clinical rotations. While lowa does not have licensure requirements for laboratory professionals, some states do. A criminal conviction may hinder an applicant's ability to get a license in a state with licensure requirements.
