



# HIGH SCHOOL AND STUDENT RECOGNITION OPPORTUNITIES

Through regular blood donation, students are demonstrating strong character, selflessness, and volunteerism. Their commitment to saving lives will set them apart from the rest!

## STUDENT ORGANIZATION AND INDIVIDUAL SCHOLARSHIP OPPORTUNITIES

LifeServe offers up to \$500 in scholarship funds to individual students or student-led groups that successfully host a blood drive during the summer (Memorial Day - Labor Day) or winter (December and January) seasons. To qualify for the scholarship, students must recruit donors, serve as the drive's chairperson, and register at least 25 donors (\$250 awarded) or 40 donors (\$500 awarded). These scholarships are available to any individual student seeking or currently achieving a higher level of education or a non-profit student group that meets the criteria.

## HIGH SCHOOL SCHOLARSHIP OPPORTUNITIES

- Your high school must sponsor two blood drives per school year to qualify
- Your high school must collect a \*minimum number of units of blood throughout the school year

<i>Memorial Day to Labor Day or December to January</i>	
25 registered donors	\$250
40 registered donors	\$500

If the school meets the minimum requirements, the school will select a student or student organization to be the recipient of the \$200 scholarship. If the minimum requirements are met and exceeded, there will be an additional \$1 for each unit collected above the threshold guidelines, with a maximum payout of \$500. LifeServe Blood Center encourages the high school to award the scholarship to a student or student organization that has been active with the blood drives or has demonstrated a strong sense of civic duty.

## DONOR OF DISTINCTION PROGRAM

High school students who register to donate blood three times before graduation or host a lifesaving scholarship blood drive will earn the honor of becoming a Donor of Distinction with LifeServe Blood Center. As a Donor of Distinction, students will be awarded the following:

- Special Red Honors Cord to Wear at Graduation
- Certificate of Achievement
- Letter of Accomplishment from LifeServe Blood Center President

To earn this title and receive the red cord, students may have to donate at a community blood drive or donor center in addition to school sponsored blood drives.
