## **APPLICATION MATERIALS** Traditional Bachelor of Science in Nursing (TBSN)

The Traditional BSN program begins in the summer and fall semesters. Required application materials can be <u>submitted as they are completed, but all materials must be</u> <u>received before admission consideration</u>. Review of completed applicant files requires 3 to 4 weeks.

## Complete applications are reviewed on a rolling basis

## The following materials must be submitted through the application portal:

- 4. Early Admission applicants only: Official high school transcript
- Official transcripts from all colleges attended Transcripts from outside the United States must be evaluated by <u>Educational</u> <u>Perspectives</u> as a Catalog Match. If a Catalog Match is not completed, the evaluation will NOT meet the requirement
- 6. Official AP score report using code 3610, if applicable

Applying from another nursing program requires a <u>letter of good standing</u> from the previous institution to be considered for admission.

Applicants whose first language is not English must prove <u>English proficiency</u> prior to admission consideration.

Meeting admission criteria does not guarantee admission into the program. Allen College uses a holistic admission review. The process balances academic achievement, work experience, extra-curricular involvement, leadership, community service, diversity, as well as other applicable life experiences. Top applicants are accepted each term.

The lowa Code (Chapter 147.3) states that conviction of certain felonies will make an individual ineligible for licensure. Previous conviction of a felony does not automatically bar an individual from eligibility for licensure. After completion of a nursing education program, the student will file an application for licensure with a state board of nursing. At that time, the board of nursing may review any felony convictions to determine eligibility for licensure.
